



Christians believe that saying the creed unifies them with Christians past and present.


The Apostle's Creed

It includes the teachings of Jesus' earliest followers (the disciples).

Having a creed meant that people couldn't cause trouble by teaching things that went against what Jesus himself had said.

Amazingly, thousands of years later, the Creed is still used by Christians today to show what they believe.




